Mars has two moons, Phobos and Deimos. Both are small and regularly shaped and may be asteroids. Interestingly, Phobos Mars at a distance of only about 5,500 miles away from its center, the closest any moon orbits to planet. In fact, if a person were to stand on
Phobos and look Mars, Mars would look
6,400 times larger than the full moon appears from Earth – taking up almost a quarter of the celestial nemisphere. Because Phobos has a low orbit, scientists believe it will crash into Mars, or, oreak up into pieces, possibly rings around the planet. Words:
