<p>Privateer</p>	<p>A pirate normally operating off the Barbary Coast of North Africa.</p>
<p>Galley</p>	<p>An individual commissioned by a government to attack foreign ships or perform raids on foreign settlements, usually for the purposes of stealing wealth</p>
<p>Mutiny</p>	<p>The papers a government issues to privateers granting permission to attack, take by force and return the goods from enemy merchant ships.</p>
<p>Ransom</p>	<p>Money or goods demanded for the return of a captured person.</p>
<p>Pardon</p>	<p>This term refers to a pirate who operated in the Caribbean Sea. The term actually originates from the French word "boucan," a wooden frame used to smoke meat.</p>
<p>Corsair</p>	<p>To destroy and steal.</p>
<p>Buccaneer</p>	<p>Forgiveness of a crime and the penalty associated with it.</p>
<p>Plunder</p>	<p>Open rebellion against constituted authority (especially by seamen or soldiers against their officers)</p>
<p>Letter of Marque</p>	<p>A large medieval vessel with a single deck propelled by sails and oars with guns at stern and prow; a complement of 1,000 men; used mainly in the Mediterranean for war and trading.</p>
